Mortimer-Pannell 24/25 Rebuild Project

Permitting Notice | November 2023



Niagara Mohawk Power Corporation d/b/a National Grid (National Grid) has begun the permitting process for our Mortimer – Pannell 24/25 Transmission Rebuild Project, located in Monroe County. Below and attached you will find more information on the Project and the permitting process.

What is the Mortimer - Pannell Rebuild Project?

The Mortimer – Pannell Rebuild Project is an approximately 16-mile 115kV electric transmission line rebuild in in the Towns of Brighton, West Henrietta, Pittsford, and Perinton, and in the Village of Pittsford, Monroe County, NY. The Project will replace aging transmission infrastructure that is over 100-years old, enhancing the electric grid in Western New York. The new lines will be placed on modern single-pole structures with the same voltage as today (115kV). The Project is estimated to begin construction in 2027.

What is the permitting process?

The Project will be permitted under Article VII of the New York State Public Service Law. The Article VII permitting process is a "one-stop-shop" for permitting and begins with an application to the New York Public Service Commission (PSC) for a Certificate of Environmental Compatibility and Public Need (Certificate). Once the Certificate is granted by the PSC, we will submit for PSC approval the Environmental Management and Construction Plan (EM&CP), which provides detailed plans for Project construction. How can I participate in the process?

The Article VII application will be available for public review in the Brighton Memorial Library, Henrietta Public Library, Fairport Public Library and Pittsford Community Library; as well as on the PSC's website (www.dps.ny.gov). As part of our outreach efforts, we will hold public information sessions in the near future to allow interested parties to gather more details and ask questions. Public comments will be accepted throughout the life of the Project. Comments can be made directly to National Grid at our contact information below.
