



At the end of May, Niagara Mohawk Power Corporation d/b/a National Grid filed a request for new electric and gas rates with the New York Public Service Commission (Commission). The Company anticipates the new rates would become effective in the Spring of 2025.

The Company's rate filing includes proposals to modernize and enhance the safety, reliability, and performance of our infrastructure, improve the customer experience, reduce system emissions, enable clean energy and energy efficiency benefits for Disadvantaged Communities, as well as fund energy affordability and efficiency programs. Altogether, the proposed rate increase seeks to ensure the Company can continue to safely and reliably serve your energy needs.

The Commission may approve, modify, or reject any or all of the proposed tariff changes. Among other potential outcomes, the Commission's determination may require revisions of the proposed amount of the increases applicable to particular classifications of service, or changes in rates applicable to those classifications for which no increase is proposed by the Company.
