- Multi-unit dwelling properties with 5+ residential units are eligible.
- Customer-side incentive caps are based on average cost.
- Installed chargers must comply with National Grid's Qualified Equipment List requirements.
- Charger rebate price caps are based on 100%; calculate 50% and 75% rebates based on the 100% values above.
- Networking is not required for MUD chargers, but rebates are available if customer purchases networking services and installs a charger on the National Grid Qualified Equipment list.
- Customers who previously participated in National Grid EV Charging Programs may not be eligible for EVSE Rebates and Networking Stipends. Please see program FAQs on website.
