NOTICE OF FILING, PUBLIC HEARING, AND REQUEST FOR COMMENTS

D.P.U. 24-160

November 12, 2024

Joint Petition of NSTAR Electric Company d/b/a Eversource Energy, Massachusetts Electric Company and Nantucket Electric Company each d/b/a National Grid, and Fitchburg Gas and Electric Light Company d/b/a Unitil for Approval of Settlement Agreement on Amendment of Transmission Service Agreements.

On October 28, 2024, NSTAR Electric Company d/b/a Eversource Energy ("Eversource"), Massachusetts Electric Company and Nantucket Electric Company each d/b/a National Grid ("National Grid"), and Fitchburg Gas and Electric Light Company d/b/a ("Unitil") (collectively, "Distribution Companies") filed with the Department of Public Utilities ("Department") the Settlement Agreement between the Distribution Companies, the NECEC Transmission LLC ("NECEC LLC"), the Attorney General of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts ("Attorney General"), and the Massachusetts Department of Energy Resources ("DOER") allowing for cost recovery associated with the amendment of certain Transmission Service Agreements associated with the Power Purchase Agreements approved in D.P.U. 18-64, D.P.U. 18-65, and D.P.U. 18-66 through each Distribution Company's respective Long-Term Renewable Contract Adjustment Mechanism. The Department docketed this matter as D.P.U. 24-160.

The Distribution Companies state that approval of the Settlement Agreement will result in a monthly bill decrease of \$1.35, or 0.7 percent for the average residential customer in the Eversource East service territory using 530 kilowatt-hours ("kWh") per month, a monthly bill decrease of \$1.38, or 0.8 percent for the average residential customer in the Eversource West service territory using 545 kWh per month, a monthly bill decrease of \$1.52, or 0.7 percent for the average residential customer in the Eversource for the average residential customer in the National Grid service territory using 600 kWh per month, and a monthly bill decrease of \$1.53, or 0.6 percent for the average residential customer in the Unitil service territory using 565 kWh per month.

The Department will conduct a virtual public hearing to receive comments on the Distribution Companies' filing. The Department will conduct the hearing using Zoom videoconferencing on **Monday, December 16, 2024**, beginning at 2:00 p.m. Attendees can join by entering the link, <u>https://us06web.zoom.us/j/88135741942</u>, from a computer, smartphone, or tablet. Please note that in the interest of transparency any comments will be posted to our website as received and without redacting personal information, such as addresses, telephone numbers, or email addresses. As such, consider the extent of information you wish to share when submitting comments. The Department strongly encourages public comments to be submitted by email. If, however, a member of the public is unable to send written comments by email, a paper copy may be sent to Mark D. Any person who desires to participate otherwise in the evidentiary phase of this proceeding shall file a petition for leave to intervene no later than 5:00 p.m. on **November 26, 2024**. A petition for leave to intervene must satisfy the timing and substantive requirements of 220 CMR 1.03. Receipt by the Department constitutes filing and determines whether a petition has been timely filed. A petition filed late may be disallowed as untimely, unless good cause is shown for waiver under 220 CMR 1.01(4). To be allowed, a petition under 220 CMR 1.03(1) must satisfy the standing requirements of G.L. c. 30A, § 10. All responses to petitions to intervene must be filed by the close of business (5:00 p.m.) on the <u>second</u> business day after the petition to intervene was filed.

All documents should be submitted to the Department in **.pdf format** by email attachment to <u>dpu.efiling@mass.gov</u> and <u>Lauren.Morris@mass.gov</u>. The text of the email must specify: (1) the docket number of the proceeding (D.P.U. 24-160); (2) the name of the person or company submitting the filing; and (3) a brief descriptive title of the document. All documents submitted in electronic format will be posted on the Department's website through our online File Room as soon as practicable (enter "24-160") at:
